The 2020 Saginaw County CROP Hunger Walk is going Virtual!

What this means is that we will attempt to raise funds as usual (or as close to "usual" as possible) throughout the remainder of September and early October. But when Walk Day arrives on Sunday, October 11th, we will not gather at the YMCA for a community-wide event as we normally would. Instead, we encourage participating walkers to walk only within their own families and only in areas of their own choosing, and then to share pictures and video of their walk on the Saginaw CROP Walk Facebook page. Once, again this year, if three or more of our church's youth (18 and under) participate and can raise \$250 together, an anonymous donor will add \$125 to their total. Proceeds benefit the international hunger-fighting work of Church World Service, and 25% of what we raise stays in Saginaw to benefit the East Side Soup Kitchen, Hidden Harvest, Samaritas Community Center, and the Saginaw Rescue Mission. 



Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)

The Offerings offer opportunities for partnership, learning, and witness and profoundly affect the life of the church as a collective witness to Jesus Christ's love for the whole church.







The Washington Correctional Center for Women is both the largest and the only maximum and medium security prison for women in the state. It's surrounded by barbed wire, and while the women within the prison may be separated from the world, they are not separated from God's love. Thanks to the work of dynamic Presbyterian leaders, a new and unique worshiping community, Hagar's Community Church, is thriving inside this fortress of concrete and steel and is supported by congregations like Skyline Presbyterian Church in nearby Tacoma.

"We are helping women process and handle their incarceration through God's love and guidance, and we want this to be a healthy, sustained ministry," explained Rev. Lane Brubaker, pastor of Hagar's Community Church.

"I think there's a lot of room for more worshiping communities like this to be established," she continued. "All of us should be listening to God to find where these worshiping communities are needed in all sorts of different unique places."
