I have learned a lesson. It does not pay to put off doing certain choirs when it comes to yardwork. I don't particularly like edging my lawn and so last year I simply did not do it. Unfortunately, ignoring this task did not help the problem. I was shocked to discover that I had to


remove whole strips of grass and dirt in order to reclaim my sidewalk. I had no idea it had gotten that bad. As I painstakingly continue to get things cleaned up, I have been reminded of a valuable lesson. Regularly maintaining something is so much better than ignoring it and then later having to deal with a much bigger issue.

As I have been spending this quality time in my yard, I've been reflecting on how our spiritual lives need regular maintenance, as well. A close relationship with God doesn't just happen. Colossians 2:6-7 states, "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness." This Scripture speaks to growth and intentionality in our walk with God. Regular maintenance in our spiritual lives might involve asking ourselves these questions: Are there any sins or bad habits that have slowly taken root in my life? Are there any good habits that I have been neglecting such as spending regular time in God's Word and in prayer?
